Parentpay

Thank you to all the parents and children who have embraced the new booking system managed through Parentpay. We have received a lot of positive feedback regarding the system as well as experiencing some initial teething problems which the Trust Administration Team have been working hard to resolve, thank you for your patience. If you are still experiencing any issues or have any queries please do not hesitate to contact your school office or e-mail the central office on enquiries@stpiranscross.co.uk

Cashless will become a reality in schools after the Christmas holidays. This means where possible all payments in to school will be processed through the Parentpay system, this will include trips, swimming, uniform and residentials. There will still be fundraising events such as non-uniform days and bake sales where cash will be requested. In some schools tuck will continue to be a cash system due to the catering contract. If you pay by childcare voucher and have not heard from your school office they will be in contact shortly to explain how this will be managed in January.

If you have lost your log in details please contact the school office and for further support from Parentpay please complete an online submission form available on their website. Parentpay are the processors of the school's data and are not allowed to pass information on to any third party which also includes talking to parents as they cannot identify them. Due to the username being verified they can email parents securely so this is the best way of contacting Parentpay.
