PE Premium Report – Bishop Bronescombe

Report Period 1st December 2013- 31st August 2014



This funding was received after conversion to a Multi-Academy Trust on 1st December 2013 during the grant period 2013/2014.

Purpose of the grant

This funding must be used to fund improvements to the provision of PE and sport, for the benefit of primary-aged pupils, in the 2013 to 2014 academic year so that they develop healthy lifestyles.

Basis of allocation

Allocations for the academic year 2013/14 are calculated using the number of pupils in Years 1 to 6, and those age 5 in Year R, as recorded on January 2013 Census (referred to as “eligible pupils” below), as follows:

- Schools with 17 or more eligible pupils receive £8,000 plus £5 per eligible pupil.
