Parent Forum Feedback

Thank you to the nine parents who attended our Parent Forum with Mr Lees and Mrs Carmichael on Tuesday afternoon. We had a wide ranging and worthwhile discussion, below is a summary of these:

1. INSET Days in 2017

Mr Lees confirmed that there will be an official announcement from St Piran's Cross CE trust in the very near future. Parent feedback from all of the school had been overwhelmingly positive and staff were in support.

2. School meals

Some concerns were expressed about school meals and in particular the St Piran's Day special. The parents would have liked more of an alternative to the meat pasty and all agreed that it would have been better served on a plate. Mrs Carmichael agreed to feed this back to Chartwells our school caterers and ask Tracy Cooke from Chartwells to attend our first Parent Forum of the summer term 2016.

3. Good manners at lunchtimes

Some parents of Key Stage 1 pupils were concerned that at lunchtime the children were not using knives and forks to eat their food. Mr Lees and Mrs Carmichael were surprised at this but promised to remind staff to be vigilant and expect the children to do this. Mrs Carmichael explained that they would shortly have an additional lunchtime supervisor to help in the school hall and we are still trying to recruit one more. Interested parents should make contact!

4. Handwriting expectations

Most parents could see some considerable improvement in their children's handwriting this year and this is due to the school's emphasis on this and encouraging children to take pride in the presentation of their learning. One or two parents were concerned that their children were not joining letters consistently and Mrs Carmichael said that she would pass their concerns back to the class teacher.

5. Grammar, spelling and punctuations expectations

Mr Lees explained that the new national curriculum had high expectations of the children in terms of their grammar, spelling and punctuation. The school has been working hard to teach these and it was agreed following a discussion that parents would value a workshop to explain these expectations. Mrs Carmichael will organise this at some point in the summer term 2016.

6. Amount of homework

Some parents are still concerned that there is some inconsistency between homework expectations between classes. Mrs Carmichael will check this again.
