Reading

Please ensure your child reads every day. Regular practice of this important skill makes such a difference! Here are our expectations:



Reception— All children take home activities to practise their phonics to read and spell.

When ready, they will be expected to read and/or discuss a home/school reading book.

Years 1-6—All children are expected to read every day from their home/school reading book.

As a general rule, the youngest children should read for approximately 10 minutes a day, building up to approximately 30 minutes a day in year 6.

Regular reading is in addition to other set homework.
