Parent Forum

Thank you to the several parents that attended our termly Parent Forum on Monday evening. A wide-ranging discussion took place that covered the following areas:

The future of St Piran's Cross MAT.

Mr Lees thanked parents for their kind words about his work and his retirement from teaching in August. He confirmed that the MAT Board are currently advertising for a replacement Executive Principal and interviews are planned for 23rd February 2017. The Trust are also considering merging with a bigger MAT as we are considered to be too small by the DfE. Any merger would be consulted upon.

Communication with Parents. Mr Lees asked parents what they thought of the school establishing a Facebook page to further engage parents. There were mixed feelings about this, with some parents in favour and some worried about how it might be used. One parent talked positively about the 'Dojo' pilot project that Mr Deadman's class are trialling. This allows for feedback on the child's day from teachers as well as an easy and effective method of communication between teachers and parents. Mrs Carmichael said she would discuss with the rest of the teachers with a view to possibly rolling out across the school in the near future. Concerns were also expressed about the late notification of special events and dressing-up days. Mrs Carmichael said that she would remind staff to give parents fair notice of these in future.

<u>School website.</u> There were some concerns expressed about how difficult aspects of the school's new website are. Parents find it impossible to download photos of their own children and the presentation of the website on mobile phones is not great. Mr Lees said that they would feedback these concerns to the website designers.

Spelling Karate. Parents all agreed that they liked the positive spelling karate approach, recognising that this encouraged their children to learn their spellings. However, two concerns were expressed about this approach: some teachers do not give enough spellings to enable the child to build up toward a black belt and staff do not always keep on top of who has achieved which level. Mrs Carmichael said that she would check on these concerns.

<u>The immersive curriculum.</u> A discussion was held about the new approach to the curriculum. Children and staff are generally positive about this approach. Parents will have the opportunity to come and observe this new approach later in the term.

<u>Charging for trips and events.</u> Parents asked if the word 'voluntary' could be dropped from the request for money for trip and visits. Mr Lees stated that we had to say this but hoped parents would pay for these special events. Most of these events are subsidised, we do make a loss on many of them. The support of parents is greatly valued.

<u>Volunteer drivers.</u> A parent asked for clarification on volunteer car drivers. Mr Lees and Mrs Carmichael said the trust's policy was that all drivers who carry children including staff must have filled in a volunteer's drivers form, have a DBS check and have the correct car insurance. This is why we try use our two new trust minibuses whenever we can.
