

Parent Survey 2017

Thank you to those parents who responded to our parent survey, the results of which are reported below.

No of responses	Percentage	Question and comments
63	100%	agreed that their child was happy and making progress at school
63	100%	agreed that their child is taught well at Bishop Bronescome School
19	30%	didn't know if we dealt with bullying effectively (Most parents said, 'I've never had to deal with issues relating to bullying'. One said 'My boys absolutely love coming to school, we are very happy parents!)
5	8%	say that they don't feel we deal effectively with bullying (2 re- sponses)/ or we 'sometimes' deal with bullying ineffectively (3)
6	10%	say their child is not given appropriate homework for their age
62	98%	believe that the school is well led and managed (1 person specified, 'didn't know')
63	100%	would be happy to recommend the school to other parents and carers
49	78%	believe that the MAT is well led and managed
14	22%	chose 'don't know' to whether the MAT was well managed and led
52	83%	Would recommend St Piran's Cross CE MAT to other parents and carers
11	17%	'didn't know' whether they would recommend the MAT. (One said, 'I don't know enough about the MAT to share an opinion')

Other comments:

A lovely, warm and welcoming school with a great atmosphere where children are celebrated. A nurturing culture and strong Christian value is always present.

Our daughter experienced bullying and it was dealt with efficiently and effectively

I think the school is brilliant and my child is thriving. Staff are attentive, caring and always on hand to discuss issues or concerns; the Head of School is also accessible and present amongst parents

I feel the school really promotes happiness and a supportive atmosphere which makes my child happy and eager to attend each day

Teachers are always helpful and always wear a smile!

Thank you for teaching and caring for my child so well, both academically and in regards to his development, character and attitude towards others. BB school places high importance on Christian values and this reflects on the staff and their dealings with the children; I am very grateful.

There were other areas about which parents raised concerns, including:

After school clubs for children in reception; ParentPay, prior warning for events; amount of homework; parking; selection of pupils for rewards and sporting events. These concerns will be discussed and considered with our Leadership Team.

We are pleased about the overwhelmingly positive response. Thank you.
