Yesterday year 5/6 took on St Stephens in the Diamond shield knock out competition.

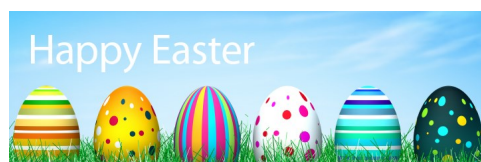

Immersive Curriculum Open Afternoon and Parent Forum

This is a chance for parents to come and join their children on the **20th March 2017** at 1.30pm. This is an opportunity to see the learning that your children do during the afternoons at school and, in particular, our new immersive curriculum approach.

The programme will be as follows:

1.30 pm – arrive and brief health and safety reminder.

1.40 to 2.30 pm – Visit to classrooms

2.30 pm – Coffee, tea and talk about the immersive curriculum. We also hold our second parent forum during this time.

Message: At Bishop Bronescombe we work with the children on anti-bullying and on understanding who they can go to for support.
