 Biblical Text: Jesus feeds the 5000: Matthew 14, Mark 6, Luke 9, John 6,

In the story Jesus was teaching over 5000 people and then he looked out and had compassion on them because he realised that they must be hungry. He asked his disciples to get food for the crowd, but they said that it would take half a year’s wages to feed the crowd. Then Andrew told Jesus that a boy was willing to share his lunch of 5 loaves and 2 fish. Jesus took the boy’s lunch, thanked God for it, and then when he broke it, there was enough to feed all 5000 people and 12 baskets of leftovers were collected!

At BB, we use this story to **empower** members of the school community to have the **courage** to share the God-given gifts and talents that they have, so that they can learn and discover without limits. We want all members of the school community to experience ‘life in all its fullness’ (John 10:10), by unashamedly being who they were created to be and for each individual to have the chance to **flourish** and **thrive**. Our vision also allows us to **celebrate difference**, and for everyone to **respect** one another’s gifts and talents.
