

Parent Forum Feedback

Thank you to the parents who attended the Parent Forum on Tuesday. A worthwhile discussion took place around the following issues and concerns:

Homework – there is some inconsistency in our classes as to when spelling and other homework is sent home. Mr Lees and Mrs Carmichael promised to discuss this with teachers at their weekly staff meeting.

RESPECT Value— each half term the school focuses on one of our Christian values and this half term we are considering the value of respect. A voluntary homework project has been set to support this work. This should be returned by the end of the term

Feedback information about Read, Write, Inc and other matters – Parent meetings take part twice a year and there will be a written report in the spring term of 2016. However, parents are always welcome to make an appointment with our teachers if they want to know more about their child's progress.

INSET Days – a discussion took place about putting all of the INSET Days together in one week in 2017. Mr Lees confirmed that parents and staff would be consulted about this in January/February 2016 and a decision made by the MAT in the early summer term of 2016.

Morning maths/Wake and Shake – a discussion took place about morning maths and the loss of wake and shake first thing in the morning. Parents had mixed opinions on this and generally parents saw the value of morning maths with its focus on arithmetic skills but also missed the wake and shake experience.
