"Learning that lasts a lifetime"

On Monday, our Collective Worship focussed on the perseverance showed by Paddy and Carol Henderson, the founders of the Trussell Trust, whose initial mission was to help the many children sleeping rough in Bulgaria. In 2000, the plight of families going hungry on their own doorstep came to their attention and they set up the first food bank from their garden shed in Salisbury. Nearly 20 years on, there are over 1200 food bank centres across the UK, serving countless families in crisis. We always like to do our bit and we are therefore asking for donations of items for our Harvest celebration on Monday, 14th October. Parents are, of course, welcome to join us.

Our big focus this year is reading and we have therefore decided to change the focus of our early morning sessions. Instead of Early Morning Maths at 8:45am each day, children will now be encouraged to get their reading books out and read to themselves, a friend or an adult (teacher, teaching assistant or volunteer). We will also be checking to see if children have read at home during this time as we know how important it is for children to read on a regular basis (we would recommend to a teaching on the age of the child).

Obviously, the more adults we have to listen to children read, the better. So if you can spare some time to support us by hearing children read in school on a fairly regular basis, at any time of the week, please talk to your child's class teacher.

We have already started planning our next reading parent workshop for parents of year 1 and 2 as well as information to support older children with further comprehension skills—watch this space for more details!


<u>Children in Need Day</u>

Our book recommendation for this week is a website called LoveReading4Kids.com. You will need to login to use it, but it is totally FREE. This marvellous website allows you (and your children) to view the first chapter of almost all new (and some old) children's books. So if your child isn't sure what kind of books they like, they can filter to see extracts from books appropriate for their age and the genre they might like to try. If there is an author they would like to read, then equally you can sort by author and 'try before you buy.' There are both extracts from both fiction and non-fiction books for all ages. Here is an extract from one of my favourite children's books -'Rooftoppers' by Katherine Rundell, taken from the website.
