Parent Forum—Thursday, 19th May

We welcomed a record number of parents and carers to our recent Parent Forum, which took place after our Open Afternoon. We hope to continue to link our Parent Forums to other events in the future!

Mrs Carmichael welcomed and introduced our School Monitoring Councillors— Jasmin York and Lindsey Allen. Their photos are on our school website if you do not already know them!

Mrs Carmichael asked for feedback on the Immersive Curriculum. Both pupils and parents report favourably on this approach. One parent reported their child saying, 'I had the best day ever' and parents feel children find experiences more memorable, especially launch days when children were historically a little reluctant to return to school at the start of term.

Other discussion:

Does the school get involved in local Swimming Galas and other local sports events?

We are increasing participation in a number of local sports competitions with some success as reported in the newsletter. Last year we did not take part in the Swimming Gala but hope to again this year.

A concern was shared about slips and falls in the Ark when it is wet and a request was made to repaint the yellow strips on outside steps. We were previously unaware of the slippery flooring in the ark and this has been noted. Mrs Carmichael will ensure that both of these issues are shared with our site supervisor and addressed as soon as possible. PLEASE NOTE: safety is paramount and the site is subject to regular checks; however, if a defect is spotted, please report to the school office as soon as possible so that we can address it swiftly.

Parents shared their concerns and frustrations with parking and traffic around school. This is a perennial issue and one should be addressed by the beginning of next academic year. Mrs Carmichael explained what these plans entail. In the meantime, as suggestion was made that cones are set out in agreed areas to ensure walkways remain clear for those parents with prams, etc. A request was made for us to display the plans and Mrs Carmichael will organise this in the near future.

A parent asked about why we did not mark St Piran's Day this year.

This was marked within classes and assembly but not acknowledged with whole school approach this year. Last year we marked the occasion with a pasty lunch but received complaints that they were too hot and difficult to eat for the younger pupils. This concern was noted and we acknowledged that this is an important time for the Cornish population.

Is the take up of meals monitored by the catering company as some options are difficult to interpret, leading to pupils avoiding some options, thereby limiting choices?

Mrs Carmichael acknowledged that the dish descriptors may need to be reconsidered as it is in the catering company's interest to serve popular meals. Mrs Carmichael advised that this would be something she will raise with them.

Since then, Caterlink have provided a picture menu, which has been uploaded to our website and which we hope will help!

Does the school recycle plastic?

Yes—we have a range of recycling bins and plastic waste bins for the playground and hall are 'in the pipeline' as our year 3 and year 4 pupils are advocating recycling. A parent has kindly offered to support the school in recycling even more!

Why are we getting texts from different numbers?

Mrs Carmichael assured parents that they were all from BB!

A concern raised that Class pages on the website have not all been updated regularly. We will pass on this concern and monitor.

A parent expressed a concern that lunchtime disputes were not being handled well by the supervisors. Mrs Carmichael acknowledged that this was not acceptable, that we aim for positive playtimes and will speak to staff to ensure this improves.
