Packed Lunches...

Whilst this lovely weather is very welcome, it does present its challenges and we are aware that some parents are concerned that their children's packed lunches are getting warm during the morning. Packed lunches are stored in cupboards and corridors that are out of direct sunlight.

Unfortunately, we are unable to provide refrigerated storage for lunches. However, we have found the following advice, which may help to ensure your child has a cool and safe lunch each day, even when it's hot and sticky outside...

- Place ice or gel packs around the food. If the lunch/snack contains perishable food items like meats, eggs, cheese, or yogurt, make sure to pack it with at least two cold sources if you can.
- Frozen juice boxes or water can also be used as freezer packs. Freeze these items overnight and use with at least one other freezer pack. By lunchtime, the liquids should be thawed and ready to drink.
- Pack lunches containing perishable food in an insulated lunchbox or soft-sided lunch bag.
- If packing a child's lunch the night before, leave it in the refrigerator overnight. The meal will stay cold longer because everything will be refrigerator temperature when it is placed in the lunchbox.
- Some foods don't need to be refrigerated to be safe. Peanut butter, crackers, dried fruit and certain whole fruits (bananas, apples, and oranges) can be eaten safely at room temperature.
- To prevent cross-contamination, don't reuse packaging materials, such as plastic bags, paper and foil food wraps.


