<ul> <li>Identify what a parable is</li> <li>Tell the story of the Lost Son from the Bible simply and recognise a link with the Christian idea of God as a forgiving Father</li> <li>Give clear, simple accounts of what the story means to Christians</li> <li>Give at least two examples of a way in which Christians show their belief in God as loving and forgiving (e.g. by saying sorry, by seeing God as welcoming them back; by forgiving others)</li> <li>Give an example of how Christians put their beliefs into practice in worship (e.g. by saying sorry to God)</li> <li>Think, talk and ask questions about whether they can learn anything from the story for themselves, exploring different ideas</li> <li>Give a reason for the ideas they have and the connections they make</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Identify where the UK is</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>To be introduced to 2Paint APicture.</li> <li>To look at the impressionist style of art (Monet, Degas, Renoir).</li> <li>To recreate pointillist art and look at the work of pointillist artists such as Seurat.</li> <li>To look at the work of Piet Mondrian and recreate it using the Lines template.</li> <li>To look at the work of William Morris and recreate it using the Patterns template eCollage</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>I know that you need a map for orienteering and can remember 3 map symbols.</li> <li>I can follow a simple train remembering a few objects seen and can now remember 5 map symbols.</li> <li>I can recognise a few pictures and relate them to areas on the ground and can sometimes work collaboratively with my partner.</li> <li>I can navigate using a simple map.</li> <li>I can sometimes use the map to find the next control and not just follow other people.</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>I can explore and compare the differences between things that are living, dead, and things that have never been alive.</li> <li>I can identify and name a variety of plants and animals in their habitats.</li> <li>I can identify and name a variety of plants and animals in their habitats, including microhabitats.</li> <li>I can describe how animals obtain their food from plants and other animals, using the idea of a simple food chain, and identify and name different sources of food.</li> <li>I can identify that most living things live in habitats to which they are suited and describe how different habitats provide for the basic needs of different kinds of animals and plants, and how they depend on each other.</li> </ul>
