

Weekly Literacy Activities

- In the story the snail slithered. Can you think of any other ways creatures move?
 Can you mind map your ideas?
- Choose your favourite Minibeast and write your own adventure like the snail in the story!
- Check out the patterns on a snails shell, have a look at photos on the internet, or better yet go on a snail hunt and have a look at a shell closely using a magnifying glass. What words can you use to describe the shell?
- At the end of the story, the snail tells his friends all about his adventure. Can you write what he might have said?
- Can you draw/paint a picture of a snail, thinking carefully about the detail and patterns on their shells.
- Use water and a paintbrush to write your own secret slime messages!

Weekly Maths Activities

- Complex patterns making spirals. The snail has a very impressive shell with a spiral pattern on it. Practise drawing and recognising spirals. Make your own spiral dangler!
- Carefully dot around your spiral using your funky fingers. Can you experiment with different patterns around your spiral to make a designer snail? You can make him as inventive as you want.
- Check out some of the maths problems below! Can you record how you solved them using a number calculation?
- The snail was very brave. Look at each page and see
 if you can find how many problems or dangers he
 might come across. Write or tally the number or just
 tell your grown up. Could you make a numbered list?
 Which do you think was his biggest problem?
- The snail certainly has an adventurous journey! Check out the pictures below of his next journey. Can you see where he goes, who he meets and if it is an odd or even number?
- Snail Trail! Snails leave a silvery trail where they have been. If you were a snail where would your trail have been today?
- "Slimy Snail sets out on a trail. But where exactly does he go? Up a hill, over a bridge, down a slope." Make a map of where you have been and talk about position and distance. Did you go under the table? Around the couch? Or plan your trail ahead – where will you leave your silvery slimy messages?


