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We are pleased to share with you that we are now partners in St Austell Safeguarding Children's Partnership.

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The aims are:

- To improve channels of communication between schools and GPs in order to ensure that young people are kept safe.

- To remove the barriers to effective information sharing between schools and GP Surgeries where there are significant safeguarding concerns.

- To align the existing safeguarding procedures in schools and surgeries in order to keep children safe, avoid wasted meeting and consultation time and develop exemplary safeguarding practices.

- Via this partnership, if either the school or the surgery have a significant safeguarding concern about a young person which requires a multi-agency approach, they may call the designated person in the partner school/surgery in order to seek confidential advice or information. This information will not be of a detailed medical or educational nature, but is likely to be very general, e.g. x has only attended school for 60% of the time over the past 6 weeks, the parent assures us that she has visited the GP- can you confirm that this is the case and that you would expect this level of absence based upon your knowledge of the pupil? Where appropriate, those designated will be invited to attend a surgery's safeguarding conference to discuss a particular child. Partner schools will also be able to request the addition of a child for whom there is a safeguarding concern to the relevant surgery's safeguarding agenda and will then attend the meeting to support the discussion. Where a surgery is uncertain which school a particular child attends this information can be requested by a designated person. All information shared is subject to the professionally accepted levels of confidentiality linked to safeguarding.

Parent Forum - 16/10

Thank you to those parents who were able to attend our termly Parent Forum. 23 parents stayed to hear more about the school's performance and development plans as well as to share their views on the school.

The forum began with Mrs Carmichael sharing some information about the school, as follows:

- 2018 performance data was shared, highlighting the ever-improving attainment of pupils. Our 'Greater Depth' attainment has improved significantly in some areas and writing progress is in the top 20% in Cornwall! If you wish to see more about attainment of our pupils, please see the School performance section (under Our School section) on the Bishop Bronescombe website.
- Mrs Carmichael also highlighted particular areas we are focussing on this year along with some of the actions and strategies planned. Spellings and Times tables are particular areas of focus so any help you can provide at home will be invaluable!
- Our Reception Patio is almost finished! Flooring is being laid this week, followed by fence panels and canopy so we are looking forward to using it after half-term.
- Extra parking spaces will be made available after half-term as Cormac will be working over the half-term break to clear the area up the lane.
- Mrs Carmichael explained a little more about her new role of Executive Head at St Winnow and explained how Mrs Greenaway will have time to support her as Miss Lawson will be assuming full responsibility for Little Fish in the Spring and Summer terms.

The forum was then opened up to attendees and the following points were discussed:

- A concern was raised that the 'Drop off' area on the roundabout is not being used to 'drop and go' and some parents are still parking in this space. A text reminder has already been sent out to parents but school staff will monitor each morning and address with those not using as we would like.
- A few concerns were raised regarding homework, spelling books and reading record comments. Mrs Carmichael will raise these with class teachers to ensure a consistent approach.
- A new initiative, Times Table Rock stars, has been rolled out and a parent was concerned that the level set for her child was not correct. Mrs Carmichael acknowledged that there have been some teething problems to start with, particularly for children in years 1 and 2. These are being addressed by KS1 staff. It was also agreed that this programme was not suitable for children at the beginning of year 1 and they would access when they are ready.
- A parent asked about Family Learning as this was really useful last year. Mrs Carmichael confirmed it would be returning this year. More details to follow.
- A parent raised a concern about one year group and the extra support needed. Mrs Carmichael talked in broad terms about extra support in place but could not give specifics to ensure confidentiality.
- Discussion took place about communication of various aspects of school life (Reception to Year 1 transition, events, music lessons, text messages etc). Mrs Carmichael reminded parents that the newsletter is always posted on the website and if they are not receiving it via email, our office staff can sort this out. Text messages can be sent out reminding of school events but cost money so we cannot send multiple messages at different times. However, we will aim to use Class Dojo a little more often and display posters in classroom windows/doors as event reminders. We will also review information-sharing around Reception to year 1 as it is a big change for parents as well as children! A parent of a child stated that they felt they needed more information around transition into year 1. This is something the school will review.
- A parent asked if audience members could access the hall earlier for school performances rather than waiting outside. Mrs Carmichael explained that the hall is being used up until the performances and we also need to ensure safeguarding of children so cannot open our doors too early. If there are special circumstances, please speak to our office staff as they could wait in the reception area.

- Discussion around our Book Fayre took place. Mrs Carmichael explained that this is a way we can engage children in reading and offer the opportunity to shop for a book themselves. In addition, the school 'earns' some books for the library by hosting the book sale. We understand that some children may find it stressful or upsetting as they do not bring in money for a book, which is why we also hold the sale after school. If you do not wish your child to go up to experience the Book Fayre during school hours, please let your child's class teacher know and they can take part in an alternative activity when the class go to the hall.
- A parent was concerned that she had missed information letters about music lessons. We offer a range of lessons with teachers from outside of the school. If you wish to find out more of what's on offer, please see staff in the office, who will be glad to help.
- A parent asked about what would be happening for those children in KS2 that would not be going on a residential trip as last year there was some disappointment that alternative activities were not offered. Mrs Carmichael advised that this is something we will aim to address this year.
- Our next Parent Forum will be held in the Spring term. We will ask for agenda items to be sent to the school ahead of the meeting to allow those that cannot attend in person to have their say. Reminders will be sent nearer the time.
