### Are you ready for Universal Credit Changes?

Do you receive any of the following....?

o Income-based Job Seeker's Allowance o Income-related Employment and Support Allowance

o Income Support o Child Tax Credit o Working Tax Credit o Housing Benefit

Universal Credit is the new single monthly payment for people in or out of work which merges together some of the benefits and tax credits that you might be getting now.

You will still have to claim separately for....

o Child Benefit o Council Tax Relief o Personal Independence Payment & Child Disability Living Allowance

o Contribution based Jobseekers Allowance

#### Payments

You may have to wait several weeks before your first payment. Universal Credit is paid in the following ways: It will be paid monthly into a bank account of your choice

If you get help with your rent, this will be included in your monthly payment – you'll then pay your landlord directly If you live with your partner and you are both eligible, you will get one monthly joint payment It can take several weeks after you make your claim to get your first payment

When will I have to move to Universal Credit?

Initially, Universal Credit will only affect people between the ages of 18 and 60 who have recently become unemployed or who are on a low income and meet certain conditions for claiming Universal Credit. However, eventually it will be brought in for everyone claiming any of the benefits and tax credits mentioned above.
