

Want to make positive changes in your child's life? Have you explored the Wellbeing and Autism Wheel tool online?

This wheel can be used to find information about autism and to guide you in finding the right support for your child.

You can also produce a plan for your child, to share with professionals as evidence of what you have tried and how you have been supported in your journey so far.

The information held within this wheel is applicable to a wide range of developmental needs, and IS NOT exclusive to autistic spectrum disorder. (I sign post many families to this tool for example if they are struggling with a child's challenging behaviour)
