Tricky Words!

Part of our Read, Write, Inc. sessions include learning 'tricky'

RED words. These are words that cannot be sounded out by using phonics because they are not phonetically decodable.

Games to try at home!



Word Pong!

What do you need? Plastic cups, a ball and some words to practice.



Have your child try to throw or bounce the ball into the cups. Each time the ball goes into a cup, they have to attempt to read the word inside.

Tricky word snap!

Write some tricky words on pieces of paper, repeating a selection of the words a few times.

Hand out some cards to yourself and your



child and take in turns turning over a card and saying the tricky word. If you put down the same word as the one before, shout SNAP!
