### Parent Forum—Thursday, 7th March

30 parents and carers attended the forum and a further 10 joined us for the Science Open Morning. Another good turnout!

Mrs Carmichael started by introducing the school's PSA—Terri-Anne Old, who has been with us since December. She has supported many families since she started and is available on Mondays, Wednesdays and Thursdays for support and advice. Mrs Carmichael went on to deliver a short presentation with a reminder of our school priorities, our actions and progress over the year. Included in the presentation is suggestions about how to support your child at home to develop their 'scientific curiosity. Discussion then followed, (Parent comments in bold / responses in italics)

#### There is dog mess on the path alongside the school.

We will let our site supervisor know to clear this. Please let our office staff know if this needs addressing as we are fortunate that Andy, our site supervisor, is on site each day and we can ensure he deals with this.

#### **Swimming Gala**

Children performed really well at the recent Swimming Gala and were more successful than in previous years. Parents felt they needed more practice on race technique and that they could benefit from special training by Polkyth instructors.

Unfortunately, our TA that led our swim team has left but our PE Lead, Mr Daysh will look into engaging Polkyth instructors or another solution.

### What ages attend the Gala and how are they chosen?

Progress and ability is checked and children identified for these events by class teachers.

### Is there going to be a lunch open day for the new starters this year?

No. We reviewed this as it was deemed too overwhelming for the young children on their first experience of school. We have changed these sessions to ensure it is calmer for the children and parents have a chance to talk with teachers.

### How will the new Reception class children be supported in getting their lunch?

Teacher and TAs support them and lunch service starts earlier for these children n the Autumn to allow them to have adequate time.

### Transition – will the children be given a slip to write their friends' names on for the new classes?

No. The decision was made after consulting with teachers that most children will remain with their current groups. If concerns have been raised by parents, we have taken these into account and moved some individuals. Letters are ready to be sent regarding our transition and this will give plenty of time for parents to discuss with their child the class they will be in. Teachers will be confirmed in the newsletter.

#### Worries about Little Fish and the many changes of staff

We are doing our best to maintain continuity and details will be published in the newsletter so all parents can see at the same time.

### Spellings and homework

Mrs Carmichael explained the 4-week programme, which focuses on consolidation and application of learnt spelling patterns. Concerns that some spelling homework has not been issued or marked are acknowledged and will be addressed with teachers. Please check with your class teacher if this happens again.

### Homework club has really helped my child as resources are there and teacher is there to help.

It makes sense to attend this club for support and this type of club continues into secondary school.

### SEN provision has improved in the last few months.

We are continuing to work to ensure when things are working this is continued. If not, we look for external support.

### Plymouth Argyle – why is the athletics club run in the hall and not outside?

This will be checked.

### There seems to be a lack of music provision

There are a number of musical instrument lessons provided and these are mainly for year 3-6. There is also a choir for years 3-6. Music lessons do take place as part of the curriculum.

There is a new Ofsted framework which places a greater emphasis on schools' provision of a broad and balanced curriculum. We are currently reviewing our curriculum to ensure all subjects are delivered equally well.

### Could you supply regular reminders about clubs and music lessons we offer?

This information is on our website but we can aim to include reminders in our newsletter.

### Nurture Room – praise for this provision and how the children have come on in leaps and bounds. Are the children staying there?

This information will be given to the individual parents. The Nurture Room will continue in September and our key member of staff is currently training to achieve Nurture Group accreditation.

### Can the children take photos of their friends for memories throughout their time in school?

No for safeguarding reasons. If you see photos on our website of your child, you can ask the office to print a copy or you.

#### Swimming in KS2 – does this count as a P.E. session? Should children have another PE session?

Yes to both. Peacocks class are currently doing dance with an external provider. Other classes should also do other PE and are also preparing for Sports Day. We will continue to monitor PE provision.

## Do we need to have more minibus drivers to enable trips as one is a current year 6 parent and will soon be leaving?

Minibus drivers need the D1 licence and we have few staff members with this licence. The Trust is looking at ways we can allow younger drivers to drive the minibuses but this currently entails them completing an expensive additional course, which is costly. We would be happy to arrange training for D1 licence holders keen to volunteer. Please let our office staff know.

### What are topics for next term?

These will be discussed with the children at transition so we follow their interests.

# Early Years' Facebook page – we should have been given more notice and what is being uploaded to the site? Why do we need to be online as photos are on the website and Tapestry?

Pictures will only be put on the Facebook page when we have parental consent and will all be in line with our Home School Agreement. People tend to not use the website but Facebook is always being used and it is a way of showing what our school is offering. Another parent voiced her support of the page as it is promoting what we are providing as a school.

### Tapestry is a wonderful communication for parents

This is for Early Years children and is not something that we judge to be suitable for older year groups.

### Parent suggestion received by email:

Would it be a good idea to suggest to parents that they also bring positive points to share, about things that they think are going well or where there have been positive changes? I know that the forums are there for parents to share their concerns but I think that there should be time at the beginning which is specifically for sharing what parents are pleased with. Perhaps a small agenda would be helpful, sent out in advance? Parents can then come prepared with both constructive things to share as well as concerns or issues, maybe finishing with a quick summary of both areas?

Positive comments are always welcomed and opportunity was given to share positive comments during this forum. We will continue to request both positive comments and concerns from now on as well as requesting topics for discussion in advance.
