


Reading party

Singing lessons

Dear Parent /Guardians

If you wish to book singing lessons for next term, the details are below

The costs of the lessons are as follows and cover a 10 week term

- Group of four £2.50 per weekly 20 minute lesson (£25.00 per child per term)
- Group of three £3.30 per weekly 20 minute lesson (£33.00 per child per term)
- Group of two £5.00 per weekly 20 minute lesson (£50.00 per child per term)
- Individual Lesson £10.00 per weekly 20 minute lesson (£100.00 per term)
 - I have been teaching in primary and secondary schools for the past five years and am fully DBS checked, experienced in teaching singing, and registered on the Cornwall Music Education Hub.
 - These lessons are run by me and are separate to the school
 - Payment for lessons must be by BACS at the start of the term, without payment, lessons will not go ahead, which may affect groups continuing.

 - Subsidised lessons may be available, details of which are given on the registration form.

The more detail you are able to provide, the better we will be able to help.

If you have noticed that something wrong, other people might have too. A teacher, health visitor or other person that knows the family might have already alerted us, and your knowledge might fill in some missing information that can help.
