A huge thank you to those of you who supported your children in the Summer Reading Challenge at St Austell Library. There were 1064 participants and 66 of them were from BB. Out of those 66 challengers, 39 read all six books and finished the challenge - that put BB in 6th place out of 22 schools that participated - isn't that great? With the half term break, you may have the opportunity to take your children to the library and enjoy choosing and reading books from there. If you weren't already convinced of the importance of reading for our children, then the National Literacy Trust, in some recent research, discovered that children who enjoy reading and do it regularly outside school are three times more likely to have high levels of mental wellbeing than those who are less engaged with reading.
