World Religion Day!

On Monday of this week, we celebrated World Religion Day. The children took part in lots of activities that allowed them to understand and appreciate the beliefs and practices of other world faiths. In Foundation stage the children learnt about Buddhism and thought about differences and similarities between themselves and Buddhists. In KS1, the children focused on the Jewish faith, they learned some Jewish dancing, made challah bread and found out how Jewish people celebrate Shabbat. In LKS2, the children looked a Buddhism, Islam and Judaism, thinking about places of worship, symbols that the different faiths use and the ways in which people who have these faiths live. UKS2 focused on Hinduism and made naan bread; designed Rangoli patterns and practised a Hindu dance.


