We are pleased to note that the Class Dojo system is working really well—it means you get to know about positive behaviour seen in school which you can then praise at home. In addition, it is providing an informal 2-way communication method to share information and reminders. Please be aware that class teachers may not be able to respond straight away and we cannot guarantee a same day response. If you feel you need to discuss an ongoing matter of concern, it may be best to arrange a meeting with the class teacher, which you can arrange via the school office, via Dojo or with the class teacher direct. Please can you address these concerns at the end of the school day when the class teacher has the time to speak to you properly?

Please note Dojo should NOT be used to inform us of absences or illness; early collection; collection by another adult or to arrange administration of medicines.

A polite reminder. - Our wraparound care is a book and pay system through Parentpay only. If you have not been able to book, you will need to call the school office on 01726 64322. We realise there are some circumstances when an emergency may arise and the school will support these odd occasions, although payment will need to be made straight away after the booking. You will no longer be able to use the facility unless this is booked and paid for in advance and the school is unable to offer any credit facilities.

Anti-Bullying week — Last week was Anti-Bullying week which this year promoted difference and equality with the tag line, 'All Different. All Unique.' During our Monday Collective Worship, we celebrated what makes the children and others at BB special and unique. We had so many fantastic ideas. Celtic Cross Education would like to recruit an enthusiastic and dedicated Maintenance Operative to work across the schools in the Trust. The post will commence on 1st January 2018.

Celtic Cross Education is a new Trust which has been formed from The Saints' Way and St Piran's Cross and currently is made up of eleven primary schools. The schools within the Trust are St Petrocs, St Michaels, St Mabyn, St Tudy, Lerryn, St Winnow, Bishop Bronescombe, Grampound Road, Grampound with Creed, Ladock and Veryan. The post will commence on 1st January 2018.

You will be required to work 37 hours per week for 52 weeks per year with holiday entitlement. You could be required to travel to any of the Trust's schools but this role is likely to see you regularly supporting at least 5 schools. A van and mobile phone will be provided.

The successful applicant will be well organised, flexible and have excellent communication skills. The person will be required to communicate well with pupils, staff, parents and other contractors in a calm and professional manner and work closely with other premises staff as and when required. A flexible, committed and adaptable individual is required to fully meet the needs of this demanding role. Ideally the candidate will have experience of the construction industry and/or grounds maintenance. The postholder must have a full driving licence.

#### Applying for a reception place for September 2018

If your child was born between 1 September 2013 and 31 August 2014 you will need to apply for a reception class place. Please visit <u>www.cornwall.gov.uk/admissions</u> to complete the online application form. This will need to be completed by 15th January 2018. Please note that attending a school's nursery does <u>not</u> guarantee your child a place at the school—you still need to apply.

medical reasons. If they are unwell and absent from school please call the office on 01726 64322, as this could result in an unauthorised absence if no reason is given.

Please note Reception children have not been included in our attendance report due to not being of statutory school age, this will be subject to change in the Spring Term.

For the individual children achieving 100% attendance throughout the week, their names will be put into a draw. Two names will be drawn and a small prize will be given to the winners.

Our current whole school attendance stands at 96%, a percentage that is in line with government expectations. Thank you for all your support in ensuring the positive attendance of your child and keeping school informed of any illness or absence.

We celebrated a fantastic week of attendance last week in celebration assembly. Thanks for all your efforts in ensuring your child attends school daily.

Our half termly meeting with the Education Welfare Officer took place this week. We spoke about initiatives put in place, following her recommendation, and the positive impact this was already having on attendance. We will continue to work with the service to identify families who need support with unauthorised absences and attendance below national expectations. Our current whole school percentage is in line with the national expectations at 96%.

A reminder—if your child will not be in school, it is important that you call and give a reason for their absence. Unexplained absences will be recorded as unauthorised after 3 days.

Just 1 day off each week means 2 months of lost education; that's 7.5 weeks, or a whole half term of missed lessons!
